The Green Energy Option program for electricity (*GEOpower*) was introduced by OES in June of 2007. *GEOpower* gives thousands of environmentally responsible energy consumers a convenient method of supporting electricity generated from renewable, non-polluting sources, such as wind and hydroelectricity.
