U.S. Energy Savings Corp. Extends Gift of Warmth Donation

Donation will assist in last few weeks of cold weather for needy Indiana families

South Bend, Indiana, March 31, 2009 – U.S. Energy Savings Corp. today announced a donation of \$10,000 to two local non-profit organizations to help keep South Bend area families warm in the remaining cold weeks of the year.

The Stone Soup Community and the Advocacy Center, both based in South Bend, Indiana, will each receive \$5,000 to be devoted to the “Gift of Warmth” program, which assists local residents who have had trouble paying for fuel to heat their homes during colder months.

Gift of Warmth is a heating assistance program locally managed by the Stone Soup Community and the Advocacy Center. The Stone Soup Community is a non-profit agency that works on-site at local food pantries, partnering with organizations to bring additional services to patrons. The Advocacy Center assists its clients with rental payments, utility reconnections and makes referrals to other agencies among other efforts.

“We are grateful to organizations like U.S. Energy Savings Corp., without which we would have a difficult time fulfilling our mission,” said Linda Jung Zimmerman, the Executive Director of the Stone Soup Community. “The donation will go a long way toward giving families peace of mind during the unpredictable, final cold weeks of the year.”

According to the Stone Soup Community and the Advocacy Center, the \$10,000 donation will support heating assistance for approximately 70 additional families in the South Bend area.
